
LOOK BACK AT TEN YEARS WITH RAYMOND HARVEY

- **1** Raymond was one of five candidates who visited town for a week, rehearsing, meeting with many, and performing. He auditioned with Rachmaninoff's E Minor Symphony.
- **2** Serving up the usual fare at a symphony concert is simply NOT Raymond's style. Always the innovator, he's continually cooking up something new for Kalamazoo.
- **3** Raymond resides in Kalamazoo and shares his gifts outside the KSO. He often adds his expertise to projects with WMU, other arts organizations, and area professionals.
- **4** *The World of...* series debuted in 2004 and quickly became an audience favorite. Raymond's bent for teaching and inimitable wit perfectly complement the music.
- **5** The *Epic Evenings* opened in 2005 with a variety of chamber music in the intimate, coffee-house setting of the Epic Theatre. It's an up-close, personal, and wonderful way to experience the music and our top players.
- **6** In March 2004 a huge audience enjoyed Raymond conducting and playing Rachmaninoff's Rhapsody on a Theme of Paganini.
- 7 The pre-concert Prelude talks place Raymond in his element as musician, teacher, and music lover. Prior to each Symphonic Series concert, hundreds enjoy his illuminating discussion and infectious passion.
- 8 Every July, Raymond takes the orchestra to six parks throughout Greater Kalamazoo for free concerts. These events are perfect for a relaxing evening with friends.
- **9** Under Raymond's leadership, the KSO continues to reach new artistic heights. With ten Artists in Residence, several WMU faculty, and many others, the KSO boasts a quality unrivaled by other regional orchestras.





Season Spotlight on Sergei Rachmaninoff

Rachmaninoff (1873–1943) was a Russian composer, pianist, and conductor, one of the last great champions of the Romantic style of European classical music. Rachmaninoff is regarded as one of the most influential pianists of the 20th century. He had legendary technical facilities and rhythmic drive, and he also had the ability to play complex compositions upon first hearing.

Not only have Rachmaninoff's works become part of the standard repertoire, but their popularity among both musicians and audiences has, if anything, increased since the middle of the twentieth century, with some of his symphonies and other orchestral works, songs and choral music recognized as masterpieces alongside the more familiar piano works.

This season the KSO will perform Rachmaninoff on several concerts. Use the Flex Ticket option to select all the Rach Pack concerts.
